By Bus

Hokkaido Museum Floor Plan and Guide

Welcome to Hokkaido Museum

Hokkaido Museum, aka Mori no Charenga, is a museum introducing the nature, history and culture of Hokkaido. The museum investigates and researches the relationship between the natural environment and people, the culture of the Ainu, and the lives of immigrants from Honshu. It also collects and preserves materials that represent a precious treasure of the people of Hokkaido, and conducts exhibitions, educational activities and events.

Start by having a look at the Main Exhibition. The Main Exhibition Hall is divided between the 1st Floor and 2nd Floor, and the exhibits are divided into five themes.

There is one Information Desk on the 1st Floor and one on the 2nd Floor, where staff are available to answer various questions.

And the Discovery Square is located on the Lower Level. Visitors from children to adults can have fun with hands-on learning that will satisfy their curiosity. Experiences range from using one's hands and body to encountering genuine items.

Main Exhibition Hall

The Main Exhibition introduces two concepts: "Hokkaido as Part of Northeast Asia" and "The Interrelationships of Nature and Humans" through five themes integrating Hokkaido's nature, history, and culture.





Information Desks

Information Desks are located on the 1st and 2nd floors; our staff are happy to answer questions.

Meeting Square

The Meeting Square is located near the 1st Floor and 2nd Floor stairs. There are desks and chairs here and the area can be used for resting or meetings. (Eating and drinking are not allowed.) The 2nd Floor has a mural depicting scenes from the frontier days of Hokkaido and an area introducing museum staff.

Close-Up Exhibitions

These are exhibition spaces where the materials and topic are changed periodically. There are seven in the exhibition hall.

Events

On weekends and holidays, there are highlight tours that explain for approximately one hour the highlights of the Main Exhibition, and various events are held. For details talk to a member of the staff or see the website.

Library (MBF)

The Library is near the spot where one exits the Main Exhibition Hall elevator and the stairs from the 1st Floor to the Lower Level. Here a person can research and receive reference services.

Sky View Square (RF)

When you ascend to the roof from the elevator, an incredible view of the city of Sapporo, Nopporo Forest Park and the Hokkaido Centennial Memorial Tower awaits you. (Only open during events.)

Lounge (M2F)

Here visitors may partake of food and beverages they have brought with them, while gazing upon the Hokkaido Centennial Memorial Tower.

Memorial Hall (1F)

This magnificent space has a red carpet, an enormous tapestry, some 1,600 horseshoes and an incredibly high ceiling.

はっけん広場 Discovery Square

This is a room where visitors can have handson experiences involving "observing intently," "encountering the real thing," "using a tool" and "making something." Using Discovery Kits that allow them to experience such things as touching a fossil or encountering Ainu culture, visitors can discover a mystery of nature, the wisdom of a person from the past or something else they didn't know. Exciting "Discovery Events" are held on weekends and holidays.
